What is Ecological Restoration?

Ecological restoration is the process of assisting the recovery of an ecosystem that has been degraded, damaged, or destroyed.

Restorative activities include: removing invasive species or reintroducing lost species, removing detritus to give native plants the space to grow, planting native vegetation, daylighting streams, or adding nutrients to degraded soil, among many others.

The goal of ecological restoration is to put the ecosystem back on a path to recovery that reflects its natural cycles, how humans are using it, and climate change.

What is the Society for Ecological Restoration?

The Society for Ecological Restoration (SER) is an international non-profit organization that advances the science, practice, and policy of ecological restoration.

SER advances ecological restoration through developing policy, publications and guidance documents, knowledge-sharing opportunities, and the certification of restoration projects and practitioners. SER has an international membership base of over 5,000 individuals from an incredible range of backgrounds.

SER's *Make a Difference Week* is an annual week of global restoration action where individuals and organizations from around the world host and participate in local volunteer restoration events to achieve a tremendous global collective impact.

Through Make a Difference Week, everyone, everywhere has a chance to positively impact their local communities by engaging with restoration projects. This is your chance to contribute to the well-being of your ecosystems!

Local individuals and organizations host ecologically-focused events, which are open to volunteers. After the week, SER gathers information from the event hosts and combines it to show the total collective impact that the Week has had. **Watch out for the results of Make a Difference Week!**

What kind of events make up Make a Difference Week?

Make a Difference Week events are volunteer events that focus on ecological restoration activities. Events are organized locally by our Event Host partners and activities are dependent on local conditions and needs. They may include: restorative plantings, seed collection and seedball making, invasive plant pulls, citizen science monitoring of restoration sites, garbage clean ups, or any other restorative activity that positively impacts the ecology of your site, community, or region.

Make a Difference Week volunteer events are wonderful opportunities to reconnect with your local ecosystems, connect and engage with local restoration projects, activities, and organizations, and **make a significant positive impact on the environment!**
